

Glossary of terms



Key Club uses many terms that may not be familiar to new members. Check out our glossary to gain a better understanding of the terms, abbreviations and their meaning.

How we operate



Division Each district is divided into territories called divisions, made up of various clubs. Each division is led by a lieutenant governor, a student leader who carries out the district's policies and provides support to the clubs.

District A district is sometimes defined by one or several states or by nation and tends to correspond to a similar Kiwanis district. Each district is chaired by a governor elected by delegates at the annual district convention.

International Key Club International encompasses all clubs within the organization's more than 30 districts and in other countries not included in any specific district. It is led by an international board, which is composed of a president, vice president and 11 trustees, all of whom are active Key Club members.

How to get in contact with leaders

How does a general member get in touch with their club president, district leaders and international leaders?

Club leaders are primarily based in high schools and hold regular meetings with all members. District leaders' contact information is typically published in district emails. International leaders have regularly published office hours that members can join. Members can also reach out to Key Club International or district leaders for international leaders' contact information. Running for a Key Club office


No matter what position you aspire to, the process for running for higher office in Key Club is similar. Here are the common action items when running for election:

- Set up your platform: Summarize your goals and experience. Familiarize yourself with existing resources and opportunities, such as the strategic plan, officer guides and tools for student leaders.
- Gather ideas: Attend your club's meetings and events with an open mind. Listen to fellow members to understand what they love about Key Club and what they need.
- Attend candidate meetings: Learn more about the responsibilities of the office. Talk to the officeholder to gain insights.
- Complete the nomination form (usually called a statement of candidacy): This is a good time to ensure your parents know the commitment and requirements.

How your international level dues are spent

At the 2024 Key Club International House of Delegates, the international dues were set at US\$10 per member, with an ongoing inflation adjustment every four years. The first inflation adjustment will be reviewed and implemented if necessary in 2028.

Here is what your dues cover:

Membership materials & recognition

Membership supplies and recognition; member pins, handbooks for members, club officers and advisors.

Governance & district travel

Travel for Key Club International board members to visit districts, meetings and conventions.

Marketing, advertising & communications

Website upkeep, social media, ads, public relations, focus groups and branding.

Education & training

Global Leadership Certificate, Governors and Administrators training, webinars, guidebooks and research.

Program staff

Key Club International staff and support staff.

Administrative fees

Every organization has administrative expenses. These include utilities, membership database, information technology support, building services, finance and accounting — all the parts that an organization needs to operate.

Youth protection

Kiwanis international has a comprehensive approach to youth protection that includes:

- Protecting, educating and engaging all Kiwanis family members.
- Protecting youth members from predators.
- Empowering and educating adult members with best practices for working with youth.
- Providing youth with positive development tools to inspire and engage our leaders to be their best.
- Creating spaces where students belong through prioritizing a culture of care where students are empowered to stand up to peer-to-peer abuse.

For Kiwanis to be the premier provider of youth service clubs and programs, we must hold ourselves and fellow members to the highest standards of conduct and awareness. A recent Key Club survey reported that 92% of Key Club members feel safe, secure and welcomed at Key Club meetings and events.

We follow the "ABCs of Youth Protection."

A - Access to high quality training. We require advisors and chaperones working with Key Clubs to complete youth protection, child abuse and sexual abuse prevention training. ALL Kiwanis members must review the Kiwanis International Youth Protection Policies on an annual basis.

B - Background checks. We require Key Club advisors and adult volunteers to maintain a valid background check to work with youth.

C - Culture of care. Today's students report the highest levels of anxiety and stress of any generation. We want our students to have resources to cope with these issues, know how to get help and be agents of change to improve their schools' cultures.

Insurance

Member

The Kiwanis International General Liability Program is designed to protect clubs and members from claims of property damage and bodily injury to non-Kiwanians or Key Club members when either is caused by a Kiwanis-sponsored event or activity. The program protects every Kiwanis club and foundation, which includes Key Club. A "member" should be listed on the official Key Club roster. The insurance policy may not provide coverage to the individual if they are not an official paid member.

Coverage

The following coverage is provided: premises, operations and activities, elevator liability, products and completed operations, owners and contractors protective, contractual liability, broad form property damage, personal injury coverage, fire legal liability, incidental malpractice, hired, rented and non-owned automobile liability, liquor liability, medical payments — third parties, members and volunteers: US\$5,000.
